Vision for the Trip

The controversy over Israel and Jewish people has been the biggest mystery amongst the nations which many times led to Jewish people being persecuted severely throughout the history and at times at the silence of the Christian world. The last big existential suffering they have faced was only under 80 years ago under the Nazi Germany. And Auschwitz was a big part of it. Now with the opportunity to witness what happened there through the biggest exhibition here in Kansas City we have the chance to connect our hearts and minds to the ugly reality of 6 million Jews getting killed out of which about 1 million in Auschwitz.

Schedule:

Phase 1: A mini symposium on what God in the Bible says regarding the questions “Who is Israel? What was her role? What is her role now? And what will be her role? How does the church relate to Israel in God's perfect union? What lessons to learn from the Holocaust? And a Q&A time afterwards.

Phase 2: Watching the film “**Covenant and Controversy Part I: The Great Rage**” to better understand the context of what's taken place at Auschwitz before our trip to the exhibition.

Phase 3: Visit to the Auschwitz exhibition at Union Station.

Phase 4: Debriefing after the exhibition to process what we have seen at the exhibition, to answer any questions and discuss the practical steps we can take as Christians to walk faithfully in God's purposes for Israel and the church in the face of growing antisemitism in the world.
