



Activity

Scenario Says

WHAT YOU NEED:

No supplies!

WHAT YOU DO:

Tell your child that integrity means choosing to be truthful in whatever you say and do. You're going to take turns reading a scenario from the list below. One of you will come up with a response that shows integrity, and one of you will think of a response that doesn't show integrity.

(Make sure to take turns coming up with the positive response versus the negative response so one person isn't exclusively thinking of negative reactions!)

- You find \$10 in the couch cushions.
- Your promised you would clean your room.
- You said you would finish your homework but you really want to go outside and meet up with a friend.
- You are at a friend's house when they start watching a movie that you know you're not allowed to watch.
- Your dad tells you goodnight and asks you to read 30 minutes before going to sleep.
- You pick up your sister's latest LEGO creation. A big chunk breaks off, and you can't fix it on your own.

3. TALK ABOUT IT!

Talk about the Bible Story

In your own words, what do you think integrity means?

Why was Daniel taken to Babylon? (Daniel was taken to Babylon because King Nebuchadnezzar conquered Judah and marched all the people to Babylon to live)

How did Daniel and his friends show integrity during their training? (They didn't eat the king's food. Doing so would dishonor God because the food had been offered to false gods)

What happened when Daniel and his friends only ate vegetables for 10 days? (they looked healthy and well fed-they looked better than the men who ate the king's food)

When can it be hard for you to tell the truth or show integrity? (Allow them to respond.)

Integrity is more than being honest. It is about being honest even if no will see or hear you being honest. (Share an example of an area in your life where you're working on integrity.)

How can you work on integrity this month?

Use this prayer as a guide, either after talking about the Bible story or sometime before bed tonight:

"God, You are faithful and never change! In everything You say and do, You have always been truthful! We can trust You no matter what. God, You made each one of us in Your image, and we want to reflect You to others. Help us to show integrity and be truthful in whatever we say or do. In Jesus name we pray. Amen"



Day 2

Read Daniel 1:3-5, 15-20

As you read verses 3-5, underline the characteristics of the young men the king was looking for. Then as you read verses 15-20, circle the description of Daniel and his friends. Lastly, draw a line from each of the things the king was looking for in these men down to the circled description that matches it in verses 15-20.

That line, the space between verses 5 and 15, represents years of living lives of integrity by Daniel and his friends!

How you live your life—what you do with the space between now and then—matters!



Sometimes when we think about being truthful, we think it just means not telling any lies. But integrity is more than that: it means being truthful with your whole life.

That's a little more overwhelming, isn't it? Thankfully we have great examples like Daniel, and we have help from God.

Gograbyourfavoritesnack. Asyoueat the food, imagine if you believed God was asking you to give it up for some reason. Would you be able to? It would be hard, but if you knew God had something better in mind, it would be a little easier, right? Don't worry, chances are good that God isn't asking you to give up fruit snacks or popcom, but there may be other things in your life that He wants you to stop or start doing, and when you are obedient to live life in the way that He's called you to, you will live a life of integrity.

As you finish your food, ask God to show you any areas of your life where you might not be living truthfully and to ive you the strength to change course!

Day 4

"Being truthful with your life" – that's a pretty big concept. And how it looks from person to person can look different. It's all about finding out who God has made you to be, and living a life of obedience to that call.

In other words, if God has made you to be a funny person, but you find yourself keeping that part of yourself away from others for fear of not being taken seriously, that wouldn't be truthful. Or maybe you'veseen Goddo something amazing in your life and when people ask you about it, you hold back and don't point to God for fear they will make fun of you. That wouldn't be truthful either.

There are so many ways to live a life of integrity, so take a few minutes to interview a few people that you see living a truthful life. Ask them what they think integrity means, and what they think it means to live a truthful life. Ask them about a time they were tempted to not live a truthful life. And be sure and tell them how you see them living out integrity!
